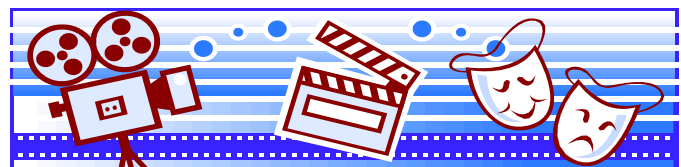

# Safe & Civil School Parent Survey Results

Five staff members from Bridger are involved in the Safe and Civil Schools Training. This is a three-year program that looks closely at areas of common concern in school buildings and works to find solutions to clear up these problem areas.

Thanks to all of you who have turned in the parent survey. It is always helpful to get another perspective on how we are doing in our school. We received 109 completed surveys that represented 150 students. This information was compiled by Research and Evaluation and forwarded to us. The results indicate the following highpoints are:

1. Students are glad to come to school most of the time and generally feel safe at school.
2. Staff members encourage students to do their best and are helpful to students.
3. The school/staff does a good job of providing help when parents/families ask for it.
4. Students believe the work they do at the school is important and are proud to be a part of this school.
5. Parents and families who visit the school are welcomed, treated with respect, and encouraged to come back.

Your responses also informed us that you were concerned about the following areas in particular – the playground, the cafeteria and the hallways. Behaviors to focus on were bullying and teasing.

A Safe and Civil Schools Committee has been established to address these concerns. The contact person from this committee is our Assistant Principal, Seth Jones. Please feel free to contact him at 503-916-6336 with any questions or concerns relating to the safety and civility of Bridger School.

## Keeping your child safe after school

- Students need to go home directly after school or to an organized after-school activity
- There is **NO SUPERVISION** for students after school unless in an after school class or club.
- Please **DO NOT** allow your child to play unsupervised on the playground after school.
- Please **DO NOT** ask office staff to take care of your child.
- Students staying for After School Classes/Clubs need to be picked up immediately following the class.
- Please make pick up arrangements for your children prior to their arrival at school. Please do not ask them to call home for pick up arrangements.

- ◆ Use tissue instead of hankies when ill, coughing or sneezing.
  - ◆ Cough or sneeze into the elbow bend of the arm if possible, or into the hands and tissue, then... **Wash those hands effectively!**
2. **Effective hand washing** is the number one way to keep germs from entering our bodies. Use plenty of soap and water, scrubbing palms of hands, fingernails, around wrists and in between fingers and under rings for **30 seconds**, then rinse and dry.
- ◆ Wash hands after recess or gym, before eating or preparing food, after using the restroom or blowing a nose, coughing or sneezing and after handling pets.
  - ◆ Do not share food, drinks or utensils; hats, combs, coats or clothing; make-up, lip balm or other personal items.
  - ◆ Do not touch the blood or body fluids of another person. Ask an adult for help.

Parent:

You will be asked to take your child home if there is:

- ◆ Rash, with **or without fever**
- ◆ Skin lesions or sores that are “wet” or pus filled
- ◆ Fever of 100.5 degrees or higher
- ◆ Vomiting
- ◆ Diarrhea
- ◆ Colored (yellow/green) drainage from eyes or ears
- ◆ Coughing: deep, barking, congested, or with colored mucous

Call your health care provider for:

- ◆ Stiff neck or headache with fever
- ◆ Behavior changes of irritability, sleepiness, fatigue or complaints of illness with inability to participate in school activities
- ◆ Prolonged diarrhea (three watery or loose stools per day or that last more than three days).
- ◆ Breathing difficulties
- ◆ Yellow color to skin or eyes (jaundice)

Please keep your child home until symptom-free for 24 hours.
