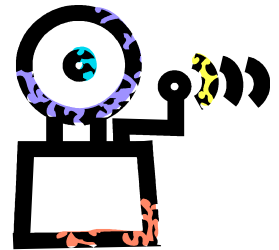

## When to Arrive at School



The Bridger School Day starts when the first bell rings at 8:40 a.m. When the tardy bell rings at 8:45 a.m. all students should be in their classrooms. Students may arrive at school as early as 8:20 a.m. in the Cafeteria for breakfast. Breakfast is free for all.

*Please do not send your children to school or drop them off prior to 8:20 a.m. There is no supervision for students prior to this time.* Dangerous situations may result from leaving students alone and unsupervised on school grounds. The only exception to the 8:20 arrival is for students who are enrolled in Vermont Hills Day Care—those students may arrive at the time arranged with Vermont Hills.

I am so excited about the upcoming year at Bridger, and I am really looking forward to working with our students and parents this year (my 3rd at Bridger) to make our school the center of excellence that I know it can be.

Our music program will again produce two major concerts (winter and spring), as well as smaller assemblies and events to showcase our amazing students. *Vocal Project*, our honor choir for students in grades 5-8, will continue meeting on Tuesday mornings at 7:45 am -- please see me to sign up! *Sound Brigade* our invitation percussion ensemble is back and will practice Thursdays at lunch -- we have an amazing starting line-up so definitely stay tuned! (Plus, I took a World Music Drumming class this summer and am just bursting with new ideas to share.) Finally, I really want to begin a recorder ensemble for our budding woodwind enthusiasts. We will need to do some fund-raising to provide instruments (there are more types of recorder out there than just the soprano!) so stay "tuned". There was talk among the District K-8 music teachers last year of continuing with an informal music festival, and if they do I would like to take at least one of our co-curricular groups. The whole District really needs to discover the amazing things that we have going on at Bridger.

Last year we produced the wonderful play *The Nightingale* and we had so much fun that we will be doing another play this year, *The Pied Piper*. This is a co-curricular activity that will rehearse Tuesday/Wednesday/Thursday after school from late November until show time mid-March. Students in grades 4 through 8 are encouraged to audition, watch for the posters!

Last year was the inaugural year for our neighborhood Student Council and we had a tremendous year learning about leadership and community service. I have so many ideas for how to make this year bigger and better, but I need you to get involved to make things happen. Elections will take place at the end of September and our new Leadership Team will head off for a start-up team-building workshop (sponsored by the Oregon Association of Students Councils) at the beginning of October.
