## STUDENT SAFETY

### SAFETY BEFORE SCHOOL

- Breakfast at no cost and will be served from **8:15-8:35 AM**.
  - There is **NO SUPERVISION** before 8:15 AM. Students should not come to school before 8:15 AM.
  - Please drop children off on the sidewalk on S.E. Market
  - **DO NOT** drive or park in parking lot (except with handicap sticker)
  - Please have your child wait in the cafeteria or out front until 8:40 AM.
  - Parents may wait with their child in the cafeteria until the 8:40 AM bell.

### TRAVELING TO SCHOOL (OR BUS STOP)

- Walk to school or bus stop on well lit streets where children can get help
- Walk with other children
- Use crosswalks, follow traffic rules, and respect other's property
- Do not talk to strangers walking or in cars or trucks on the way to school
- Wait on sidewalk or grassy curb for bus.
- Do not run into street, throw things at others, push or quarrel.
- Remember good citizen behavior at the bus stop.

### SAFETY DURING THE DAY

- Students are not allowed to leave the school grounds during the day (8:40-3:00) without having a parent/guardian sign them out
  - All **visitors MUST** report directly to the school office to sign in and receive a visitor tag. **Regular parent volunteers/visitors included.**
  - **DO NOT** go to your child's classroom to pick them up. Check in the office first.

### SAFETY AFTER SCHOOL

- Students are to go home directly after school or to an organized after school activity.
- There is **NO SUPERVISION** for students after school unless in an after school class/club.
- Please do not ask the office staff to take care of your child
- Students staying for After School Classes/Clubs need to be picked up immediately following the class.
- All students should know who will pick them up and where they will go after school everyday. Please help by checking with your child in the morning. Do not ask them to call home

### ABSENCE AND TARDINESS PROCEDURES

Regular attendance contributes to success in school. Students should be sent to school on time and ready to learn. If your child is sick, please keep him/her at home. Send a written excuse when your child returns to school. Contact your child's teacher regarding making up assignments.

If you want your child excused during the school day or are changing the pick-up person, please put your request in writing to your child's teacher. **PLEASE NOTE WHO WILL PICK UP YOUR CHILD.** If you pick up your child early, please wait in the office for your child. Staff needs to see you meet your child in the office.

### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT KEEPING YOUR CHILD HOME FROM SCHOOL

To help determine whether a health issue would keep a child from attending school, please refer to the following chart. Please do not send an ill child to school. If you need help finding a health care provider, call the Multnomah County Health Department at 503-248-3816 or School Health Services at 503-257-1732,

Student's symptoms:	Student may return to school when:
Fever greater than 100 degrees	Temperature below 100 degrees for a minimum of 24 hours without use of fever-reducing medication.
Drainage from nose or eyes	Discharge must be gone or student must have been on antibiotics for 24 hours and have doctor's written permission to return to school.
Rash	Rash disappears or student must have doctor's written permission to return to school
Vomiting or Diarrhea	Symptom-free for 24 hours.
Cough: Deep, barking, congested or productive mucous	Symptom-free or student must have been on antibiotics for 24 hours and have doctor's written permission to return to school.
Unusually sleepy, lethargic or grumpy	Symptom free.
Strep throat diagnosed by doctor	On antibiotics for 24 hours and doctor's written permission to return to school.

### ACCIDENT AND ILLNESS

Only first aid care may be given at school. In case of serious accident or illness, we will try our best to:

1. Contact parent(s) or legal guardian,
2. Contact the given emergency number(s),
3. Take child to the hospital (if emergencies arise).

***Please let us know as soon as possible if there is any change in your home, work, or emergency numbers.***

Medicine can only be given to students who have provided the school with permission forms signed by a physician or a parent. (These forms may be obtained from the school office.)

Our school participates in a computerized ticket system. Students must go to the cafeteria BEFORE school to pay for lunch.

If a student forgets their lunch money (or their card runs out), they are eligible to receive milk, bread, vegetables and fruit for the day. We do not encourage borrowing lunch money. Please maintain a record of your child's meal card use.

**DRESS CODE**

- Everyone wishing to volunteer must complete a Criminal Background Check form. Verification is good for three (3) years. Assistance is available for the \$5 processing fee.

Sign in and out of the building in the Volunteer Notebook located in the office. Keep records of all additional volunteer time (off site, etc.) if possible.
- If you plan to drive students on a field trip you will need to complete a Private Vehicle Use Form.
